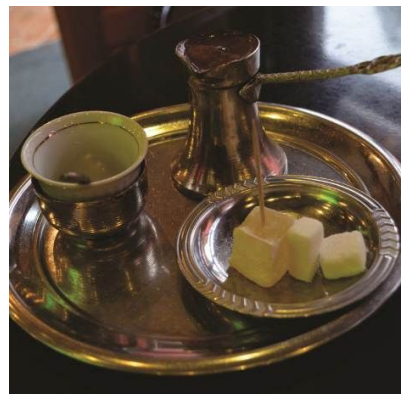


Short Tour of Croatia, Bosna and Herzegovina and Serbia

8 days – 7 nights



Go down the paths of the Dubrovnik Republic and stroll through Mostar to the European Jerusalem - Sarajevo. The road takes you next to Zagreb and then to beautiful Plitvice Lakes. Visit Trogir - the city under UNESCO protection and complete the tour in Diocletian's Split.

Dubrovnik, a city of unique political and cultural history of the centuries-old Dubrovnik Republic. Under the protection of St. Blaise lies one of the most attractive cities in the Mediterranean. Experience the harmony of man and architecture.

Mostar as a window to the Orient is the commercial center of the Ottoman era. Explore the Old Bazaar, a variety of shops, mosques, Turkish house and the imposing bridge that gives the town its name. This is the right place where East meets West.



Sarajevo is surrounded by mountains and rich healthy spring waters. It is the intersection of religions and cultures of the great empires of European history.

Belgrade with its fortress which dominates the confluence of Sava River into Danube and its unique Knez Mihajlova street where past meets future.

Zagreb, placed in the heart of Europe with highlights like the Gothic cathedral, the picturesque market Dolac, Upper Town with the church of St. Mark's and the shortest funicular in the world-Uspinjača.

Plitvice is the oldest and most famous National Park with lakes, countless waterfalls with wonderful atmosphere, rich flora and fauna.



Trogir is the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic town in Central Europe, with the Cathedral of St. Lawrence and Radovan's portal, Tower Kamerlengo and Palace Čipiko which makes it an interesting place to visit.

Split has been an urban and cultural center of Dalmatia for 1700 years. With variety of archaeological, historical and cultural monuments, among which is a special Diocletian's Palace, Split leaves you speechless.

ITINERARY

D1 Sunday / DUBROVNIK – Arrival

Upon arrival at Dubrovnik Airport, transfer to hotel. Meet the tour guide, dinner and overnight.

D2 Monday / DUBROVNIK – MOSTAR – SARAJEVO

Morning departure for Mostar. Sightseeing tour of the Old City of Mostar, recently included in the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Heritage. We tour its elegant Bridge, Old Bazaar, the Mosque and a typical Turkish house. Continuation to Sarajevo. Afternoon city tour of Sarajevo, including Baščaršija and Gazi Husref Bey Mosque. Dinner and overnight in Sarajevo.

D3 Tuesday / SARAJEVO – BELGRADE

After breakfast, we drive northwards to Belgrade, with a stop in time for lunch. Continuation to Belgrade, dinner and overnight.

D4 Wednesday / BELGRADE – ZAGREB

In the morning city tour of Belgrade, the tour includes a visit to the imposing Kalemegdan Fortress, dramatically set at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers. You'll also see Republic Square and Knez Mihajlova Street, Saint Sava Temple, the largest Orthodox Church in the city, and Tito's Memorial. Continuation to Zagreb for dinner and overnight.

D5 Thursday / ZAGREB – PLITVICE

Morning city tour of Zagreb, including the fortified Upper Town, the city's historical center, St. Mark's Church with its multicolored roof, the Cathedral, the Croatian National Theatre and the University. After the city tour, drive to Plitvice and tour the Plitvice Lakes National Park on the UNESCO's List of World Natural Heritage. Sixteen lakes, each at the different level, are joined in a series of cascading waterfalls. Surrounded by dense wood Plitvice Lakes are a natural phenomenon of a rare and unique beauty. Dinner and overnight in Plitvice.

D6 Friday / PLITVICE – TROGIR – SPLIT

Morning departure for Trogir where we visit the Cathedral of St. Lawrence. Continuation to Split; city tour of Split, including the Diocletian's Palace on the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Heritage with the Peristyle, the Jupiter's Temple and the Cathedral. Dinner and overnight in Split.

D7 Saturday / SPLIT – DUBROVNIK

After breakfast, departure for Dubrovnik. Sightseeing tour of Dubrovnik, included in the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Heritage. You will visit the Franciscan monastery with Europe's third oldest pharmacy, the Rector's Palace and the Cathedral. Dinner and overnight in Dubrovnik.

D8 Sunday / DUBROVNIK – Departure

After breakfast, the tour ends with a transfer to Dubrovnik Airport.
